## MEGHAN MARKLE AND PRINCE HARRY TO TAKE BABY ARCHIE TO AFRICA ON COMMERCIAL FLIGHT AFTER PRIVATE JET STORM AS TOUR DETAILS

MEGHAN Markle and Prince Harry will take baby Archie to Africa on a commercial flight after being caught up in a private jet row, it was revealed today.

The Duke and Duchess of Sussex will fly to South Africa with their four-month-old son in barely two weeks - just after Prince Harry insisted he only flew on private jets to protect his family.

The 34-year-old claimed he flew on commercial airlines "99 per cent" of the time this week after being criticised for jetsetting on four private planes in just 11 days during the summer.

Speaking at the A'Dam Tower just a few days ago, he told the crowd: "Occasionally, there needs to be an opportunity based on a unique circumstance to ensure that my family are safe, it's genuinely as simple as that."

He and wife Meghan Markle jetted to Nice and Ibiza over barely two weeks in August, creating seven times the normal amount of carbon emissions on the flights, despite preaching over the importance of the environment.

But the couple are expected to travel on commercial flights as they begin their ten-day tour of Africa with baby Archie later this month. And the Sussexes will throw their weight behind causes including the environment, female empowerment and kids on the tour.

## MEGHAN MARKLE AND PRINCE HARRY REVEAL DETAILS OF UPCOMING ROYAL TOUR TO AFRICA

The <u>Duke and Duchess of Sussex</u> have revealed details of their upcoming <u>royal</u> tour to Southern Africa on <u>social media</u>. In June, it was announced that the duke, duchess and their son, <u>Archie Harrison</u> <u>Mountbatten-Windsor</u>, would be embarking on a trip to Southern Africa in autumn for their first official tour as a family.

With the trip now just two weeks away, the royal couple have used their official Instagram account to share what the tour will entail, including several pictures and a caption which details the organisations and individuals they are due to meet as part of their busy itinerary.

The aim of the tour, as stated in the Instagram caption, is to focus on "community, grassroots leadership, women's and girl's rights, mental health, HIV/AIDS and the environment".

The caption outlined that the tour has been "many months in the making", and that Prince Harry and Meghan are "eager to focus their energies on the great work being done in Southern Africa".
